The meeting was called to order at 2:00 p.m. by Chairman Beaumont after ascertaining that the Notice of Meeting had been posted in accordance with the law. Commissioner Moses gave the invocation.

Minutes of Meeting No. 2457

The Minutes of Meeting No. 2457 were approved as read.

Public Comment

Mr. Ike Mills wished the board and attendees a happy new year and thanked the District for all that they do to further economic development.

Consider Pay Request No. 2 to Brystar Contracting, Inc. for Sanitary Sewer Line Relocation at Lake Charles Lift Station

Mr. Keith Zotsky with Arceneaux, Wilson and Cole, Inc. presented Pay Request No. 2 submitted by Brystar Contracting, Inc. for the Relocation of the Sanitary Sewer Line at Lake Charles Lift Station for approval. Mr. Zotsky submitted an invoice from Brystar Contracting, Inc. for Three Hundred Seventy-Two Thousand Four Hundred Sixty-Four and 60/100 (\$372,464.60) for traffic control, trench safety system, dewatering, .42" PVC sanitary sewer line, and manholes. Approximately 60% of the project is complete. The request has been reviewed, and it is recommended that the Board approve Pay Request No. 2 in the amount of Three Hundred Seventy-Two Thousand Four Hundred Sixty-Four and 60/100 (\$372,464.60) Dollars. Commissioner Vincent moved to approve Pay Request No. 2 from Brystar Contracting, Inc. for Relocation of the Sanitary Sewer Line at the Lake Charles Lift Station in the amount of Three Hundred Seventy-Two Thousand Four Hundred Sixty-Four and 60/100 (\$372,464.60) Dollars. Commissioner Gamble seconded the motion. The motion carried.

Consider Pay Request No. 1 to Cummins, Inc. for Diesel Engines and Reduction Gears for Star Lake & Rodair Pump Stations

Mr. Kirby Johnson presented Pay Request No. 1 from Cummins, Inc. for two (2) Diesel Engines and Reduction Gears for Star Lake and Rodair Pump Stations for approval. Mr. Johnson submitted an invoice from Cummins, Inc. for Two Hundred Sixty Thousand Seven Hundred Fifty-Six and 00/100 (\$260,756.00). The contractor is

requesting payment for two (2) 500 HP Marine Auxiliary Engines with Appurtenances, two (2) Engine Reduction Gears for 500 HP Engines, and tariff charges. The request has been reviewed, and it is recommended that the Board approve Pay Request No. 1 in the amount of Two Hundred Sixty Thousand Seven Hundred Fifty-Six and 00/100 (\$260,756.00) Dollars. Commissioner Moses moved to approve Pay Request No. 1 from Cummins, Inc. for Diesel Engines and Reduction Gears for Star Lake & Rodair Pump Stations in the amount of Two Hundred Sixty Thousand Seven Hundred Fifty-Six and 00/100 (\$260,756.00) Dollars. Commissioner Champagne seconded the motion. The motion carried.

Sabine Pass to Galveston Bay Summary

Mr. Allen Sims reported that a meeting will be held next Wednesday or Thursday with General Walter and Mr. Hibner. The Assistant Secretary of the Army for Civil Works, Adam Telle, is scheduled to be in Houston on January 21, 2026, where he will meet with the General Manager of the Gulf Coast Protection District and Mr. Sims to tour the Port of Houston and the District facilities. Representatives from Washington, D.C. will also be in the area the week of January 21, 2026, for meetings. In addition, an executive leadership meeting will be held on January 21, 2026, with the Colonel and General to review the projects.

Mr. Sims also reported that reimbursement was received for the District's backhoe that was destroyed by a contractor at a job site. The District has since purchased a replacement backhoe using the reimbursed funds.

A possible resolution to the coating issue on contract 4 may have been reached. The Corps told the contractor that no coatings will be allowed on the sheet pile. A new design with no coating is expected.

Manager Reports

The City of Port Arthur Chamber of Commerce Annual Luncheon will be held on January 13, 2026, at the Bob Bowers Civic Center. General Land Office Commissioner Dawn Buckingham will serve as the guest speaker. The District has purchased a table for the luncheon. Mr. Sims requested that anyone interested in attending contact him. To date, the District's 35% cost share for the Sabine Pass to Galveston Bay Project has been provided by the General Land Office.

Mr. Sims also advised that on January 14, 2026, he will make a presentation to the Texas Gulf Coast Infrastructure Coalition at Texas A&M University in Galveston, Texas. The presentation will focus on non-federal sponsors working with the federal government and the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers on coastal storm risk reduction projects.

Mr. Sims further reported that the current design of the Shreveport pump station rake system is not appropriate. Mr. Toby Davis, Mr. Rene Jackson, and Mr. Eric Williams will travel to Dallas on January 15, 2026, to review alternative rake system designs that may prove to be more effective.

The District is constructing an additional employee parking lot to allow employees to park away from equipment traffic. This project was included in the current year's budget. In addition, a new covered area will be constructed near the existing covered area to provide more shelter for equipment that does not fit under the existing covered structure.

The District's new SCADA system project remains ongoing. The contractor has completed wiring at the old Alligator Pump Station for integration into the new system and is proceeding to the next station.


