The meeting was called to order at 2:00 p.m. by Vice Chairman Champagne after ascertaining that the Notice of Meeting had been posted in accordance with the law. Commissioner Moses gave the invocation.

Minutes of Meeting No. 2443

The Minutes of Meeting No. 2443 were approved as read.

<u>Consider Resolution Adopting 2025 Jefferson County Drainage District No. 7 Hazard Mitigation Plan Update</u>

Consider Resolution No. 536 Adopting the 2025 Jefferson County Drainage District No. 7 Hazard Mitigation Plan Update. Mr. Sims stated that an updated Hazard Mitigation Plan is required every 5 years by the state and federal entities that offer grants which the

District utilizes for many of its projects. Commissioner Vincent moved to approve Resolution No. 536 authorizing the Adoption of the 2025 Jefferson County Drainage District No. 7 Hazard Mitigation Plan Update. Commissioner Moses seconded the motion. The motion carried. A copy of Resolution No. 536 is attached hereto and made a part of these minutes.

Sabine Pass to Galveston Bay Summary

Mr. Allen Sims stated that the funds that were originally to be allocated to the District for the Sabine Pass to Galveston Bay Project were removed from House Bill 1 as well as Senate Bill 500 which was the supplemental funding. There was no explanation given, only that it was a last-minute decision. Mr. Sims stated that he was advised that when the federal budget was passed there were no funds allocated for the Coastal Texas Project and since there is approximately \$600 million in funds still available from 2021 and 2023 State budget allocations the current legislature decided not to give more funds in the 2025 budget. The District is in negotiations with the Gulf Coast Protection District (GCPD) board members and staff relating to the \$350 million that was supposed to be allocated to the Coastal Texas Project (Ike Dike Project). The GCPD's current plan is to set aside approximately \$150 million out of the \$350 million to begin engineering. The remaining \$200 million would be available to the District to fund its projects. Currently, the District's project is officially budgeted at \$863 million in accordance with the United States Corps of Engineers (USACE). USACE is currently working on a Post Authorization Change Report (PACR) which is scheduled for completion in July. The PACR will then go to the review process which will expect approval in July 2026. PACR approval will allow USACE to move funds within the Sabine Pass to Galveston Bay Project budget

which could allow the unused funds from the Velasco Project to be reallocated to DD7 to complete its project.

Commissioner Champagne asked if the work that is being performed in Port Acres at Hwy 365 part of the Sabine Pass to Galveston Bay Project. Mr. Sims stated that it is and is considered fronting protection from storm surge which will protect Rodair Pump Station, Lakeside Pump Station, Alligator Pump Station, and their surrounding areas.

The last day to appeal Contract 4 was June 2, 2025. A contracting officer kick-off meeting is scheduled for June 11, 2025, which is a meeting between the USACE and the contractor. There will also be a town hall meeting later this summer in the affected area to advise the community on what is being done and what to expect during and after construction.

The District held an Executive Governance Meeting on May 29, 2025. Approximately twenty-five people attended, including the Colonel, and a division representative attended via teleconference. It was a positive and productive meeting. The District's goal is to get all its projects under construction in the next two years which would allow it to obtain the available previously committed funding.

Manager Reports

Mr. Sims stated that the District has been preparing for the hurricane season procuring equipment, supplies, fuel, food, etc., ensuring that all gates and structures are working properly, ditches are clear, and equipment and vehicles are serviced. The District has an agreement with ISTC to house/shelter employees if a storm surge greater than 20 feet is expected. An all-hands meeting will be held June 18, 2025, to hand out schedules, explain what each department's duties are, etc.

The District had its first test of the 4-10 schedule and call outs. Everyone that was called out responded. All employees have positive reviews of the new work schedule.

The bill submitted to the State House and Senate to change the District's board elections from May to November passed both the House and Senate. Upon the signature of the Governor the bill will go into effect immediately or 19 days from the date of the last vote. Commissioner Moses and Commissioner Champagne are up for re-election November 2025.

<u>Executive Session - Consider and Take Action, if any, on Items Discussed in Executive Session</u>

No Executive Session was held.

Cardinal Conservation & Management LLC is submitting a permit for HFPL property access. The permit fee is \$550.00. Mr. Brady Girouard recommended approval subject to the special conditions contained within the permit. Commissioner Moses moved to approve the permit requested by Cardinal Conservation & Management LLC as recommended by Mr. Girouard. Commissioner Vincent seconded the motion. The motion carried.

Stash Box Storage is submitting a permit for two 24" HDPE discharge pipes directly entering the District's Crane Bayou main channel. The permit fee is \$315.00. Mr. Garrett Boudoin recommended approval subject to the special conditions contained within the permit. Commissioner Moses to approve the permit requested by Stash Box Storage as recommended by Mr. Boudoin. Commissioner Gamble seconded the motion. The motion carried.
