The meeting was called to order at 2:00 p.m. by Chairman Beaumont after ascertaining that the Notice of Meeting had been posted in accordance with the law. Commissioner Moses gave the invocation.

Minutes of Meeting No. 2424

The Minutes of Meeting No. 2424 was approved as read.

<u>Consider Award of Bid for Supply and Delivery of Pre-Cast Concrete Box Culverts for</u> Future Rodair Gully Detention Pond Pump Station

Mr. Kirby Johnson stated that the proposals for the Supply and Delivery of Pre-Cast Concrete Box Culverts for the Future Rodair Gully Detention Pond Pump Station were opened at the board meeting held on August 6, 2024. The responding companies were Southern Sourcing Solutions, LLC and Doughtie Construction Co., Inc. Both bidders

complied with the bid requirements. References were checked. A recommendation letter was submitted by Mr. Johnson recommending the low bidder, Southern Sourcing Solutions, LLC be awarded the bid in the amount of Two Hundred Thousand Five Hundred Thirty-Four and 40/100 (\$200,534.40) Dollars with 60 working days. Commissioner Moses moved to award the Supply and Delivery of Pre-Cast Concrete Box Culverts for the Future Rodair Gully Detention Pond Pump Station bid to Southern Sourcing Solutions, LLC for the amount of Two Hundred Twenty Thousand Five Hundred Thirty-Four and 40/100 (\$220,534.40) Dollars. Commissioner Champagne seconded the motion. The motion carried.

Consider Proposed Tax Rate for Purposes of Publishing Notice of Public Tax Hearing on Tax Rate

Mr. Kelley stated that this week's meeting packet included a draft Notice of Public Hearing on Tax Rate that reflects a zero-dollar tax increase. At the previous Board meeting, Mr. Allen Sims submitted different tax rate scenarios for the Board's consideration. Discussion was had amongst the Board members and the majority was in favor of Mr. Sims' proposal to lower the tax rate from 0.320573 to 0.297632 (a decrease of 7.16%) which will result in no increase in taxes for the average homeowner but will decrease the District's revenue by approximately \$1,901,632. Commissioner Vincent moved to approve the proposed rate of 0.297632 per \$100 value for the purpose of publishing the Notice of Public Hearing on Tax Rate. Commissioner Champagne seconded the motion. The motion carried.

Consider Resolution Adopting Written Investment Policy

Resolution No. 520 Adopting Written Investment Policy was presented to the Board for consideration. Mr. Phil Kelley stated that this is an annual routine formality. Mr.

Allen Sims and Mrs. Alex Thibodeaux completed an online Public Funds Investments training course. The District's Investment Policy was revised to bring it into compliance with state laws and to accommodate the change in the District's bank and depository services. The District needs to establish an Investment Advisory Committee consisting of the District's Assistant Manager, the District's Accountant, and one or two of the District's Board. The Committee will meet annually to evaluate the District's investments and ensure they align with the District's goals. The Investment Policy Act states that the District should be attempting to maximize the District's interest income. The recent change in the District's bank and depository services is a positive step in maximizing the District's interest income. Mr. Kelley stated that if the Board approves Resolution No. 520 Adopting the amended Written Investment Policy, they will also approve appointing the Assistant Manager and District Accountant as Investment Officers. Commissioner Champagne moved to approve Resolution No. 520 Adopting Written Investment Policy. Commissioner Moses seconded the motion. The motion carried. A copy of Resolution No. 520 is attached to and made part of these minutes.

Consider Appointing Commissioner(s) to the Investment Policy Committee

Mr. Phil Kelley asked if a member(s) of the Board would like to volunteer to be a part of the District's Investment Policy Committee. The Committee would likely only meet once a year and give an annual report to the Board. Commissioner Moses moved to appoint Commissioner Champagne to the District's Investment Policy Committee. Commissioner Champagne seconded the motion. The motion carried.

Commissioner Vincent moved to declare the subject property as surplus and to be sold. Commissioner Champagne seconded the motion. The motion carried.

Sabine Pass to Galveston Bay Project Summary

Mr. Allen Sims stated that he, Mr. Phil Kelley, Mr. Toby Davis, Mrs Alex Thibodeaux and Mr. Barron Cook attended meetings with the Gulf Coast Protection District ("GCPD") and Corps last week. The meeting with the Corps was related to the method to acquire easements along the wall. The main concern is the language of the easement agreements and how the District can control what is allowed to be placed on the surface near or against the wall. The current easement agreement states that the District has no say in what is put on the surface. The issue is what is placed on the surface can negatively affect the footings underneath the wall. The Corps wants the District to put restrictions on what can be placed on the surface near or against the wall. Mr. Kelley

stated this wall will be supported by subsurface piles at an angle. The District has to provide a subsurface easement to protect the tips of those piles, but the District will not own the surface. The District cannot restrict what is put on someone else's property. Mr. Sims stated that the second issue that was discussed with the Corps is the 2022 Coastal Hazards model which determines the height of the levee. Errors were discovered in the model that will change the height of the levee significantly. A discussion was held with the Colonel, Lieutenant Colonel and others from the Corps to determine how this was overlooked and how the issue would be resolved. The Corps acknowledged that they made a mistake and are working to develop options to resolve the errors.

Manager Reports

Mr. Phil Kelley presented the financial statements prepared by FMW, P.C. for the period ending July 31, 2024, and gave a collateral securities report as of July 31, 2024.

Mr. Allen Sims stated that he has been working on the budget for the upcoming year. Insurance costs will be significantly higher. The cost of doing business has increased in general, but the budget is not expected to change much. The grant projects that have not moved forward, will begin progressing next year due to deadlines.

Mr. Sims stated that the District applied for a Flood Mitigation Assistance Grant to fund a new Master Drainage Study. Notice was received last week advising that the District was awarded a 1.2 million dollar grant. The District has applied for three more grants to help fund the study. Mr. Kelley stated that District has already advertised for proposals and qualifications for grant administrators and engineering firms. Freese and Nichols, Inc. and LJA Engineering, Inc. will were selected to provide services associated with the grant projects, i.e. perform this study.

Mr. Kelley, Mr. Sims, and Mr. Beaumont attended a ceremony at the Jefferson County Courthouse last week where the Texas General Land Office presented the District with a 41.6 million dollar cardboard check. The funds will be distributed after the District signs the contract and work begins.

Permits

USA Rail Terminals Beaumont proposed modifications to Lateral A-1 and A-1-C. Mr. Garrett Boudoin recommended approval of the permit with a permit fee of \$1,020.00 and no bond required. Commissioner Champagne moved to approve Mr. Boudoin's recommendation. Commissioner Moses seconded the motion. The motion carried.
